At age 90, Newton has experienced tremendous loss. A member of the Crow Tribe, he served in the Korean War, became a widower in 2017 and lost 19 friends and family members to COVID-19. Newton is fully vaccinated, but he suffers from medical issues and must watch his diet.

Recently, he and other Elders of Crow Agency received a summer emergency box with nonperishable food, water, and hygiene items through our Sioux Nation Relief Fund program.

The Haaland v. Brackeen decision from the Supreme Court is a resounding affirmation that Native people are seen as politically distinct, sovereign nations, and inextricably linked to the core of the American judicial system.

Having worked in the tribal foster care system, the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) has been the gold standard, when properly exercised, for all foster care systems because of its common sense approach to the 'best interest of the child' philosophy. Our children are seen, our people are heard, and our communities are recognized by an unmistakable margin with a 7-2 vote.
